Aschersleben is first mentioned in a deed of donation in 753. This was recorded in the 12th century in the Codex Eberhardi - a compilation of property of the Fulda monastery, which was prepared by the monk Eberhard. With this date of relevance, Aschersleben sees itself as the oldest documented town in Saxony-Anhalt. Aschersleben gained importance in the 12th and 13th centuries as the seat of the Ascanians, the name being derived from Ascania which is the Latinized form of Aschersleben. One of the most important representatives of this ruling family was Albrecht the Bear (1100-1170). He was one of the most influential princes of his time and is considered the founder of the Principality of Anhalt. Historical documents verify his stays in Aschersleben.

The International Building Exhibition Urban Redevelopment and the State Horticultural Show in 2010 gave Aschersleben lasting foundational impulses that can be seen and felt everywhere. The city has become an attractive place to live and work, which proudly displays its history with the medieval city fortifications, St. Stephen's Church and the former farm houses as well as the modern, award-winning architecture in Bestehornpark and the inner-city gardens and parks.

In addition to a flourishing economy, traditional agriculture as well as urban redevelopment, the city relies on an excellent cultural and educational landscape.

Last but not least, Aschersleben has grown – eleven villages are now enlivening and promoting the coexistence of town and country. There is always something special to discover and experience: Treasures from the past and present, monuments from almost all architectural eras, historical and modern parks, well-known art, diverse events as well as leisure and cultural facilities.

art in public space

Outstanding works of art are, for example, the altars from the workshop of Lucas Cranach the Elder in St. Stephani, the moon on the Herrenbreite by Moritz Götze or the Aschersleber Globus in the city park. All of them are described in the brochure "Kunstwerke und Kunstorte".

A modern art project is the DRIVE THRU Gallery. The "drive-through gallery" is an installation of various works of art along the main arterial road B180, which runs through the middle of Aschersleben. It allows drivers to experience art in the open air and was created for the International Building Exhibition (IBA) 2010.





Aschersleben invites you to not only visit but discover. Experience a guided tour of the city, take a walk to see all the artworks in the city or follow the 3 routes of the tourist pedestrian guide: Architectural Route, City Fortification Route and Park Route.

Along these routes you will certainly see all the sights, taking you to the most beautiful houses, towers and parks. Stelae and information boards mark the way on historic buildings, describe their history and structural features. Each route has its own colour, numbering and a special brochure.

city fortification route

Construction of a city fortification began as early as 1322. The present facilities date back mainly to the 15th century. The city fortifications of about 2.2 km in length decreed over 51 towers and shells (fortifications open to the city side), 15 of which are still standing today. Five main gates once secured the city however, only the Johannistor tower has survived. In the second half of the 19th century, the city moats were filled in and a decorative promenade was laid out known today as the Promenadenring.Aschersleben puts great importance on the preservation of the fortifications and is proud to be able to present one of the most well-preserved fortifications in Germany to its visitors.

Gardens and Parks – Park Route

Artistically designed gardens and parks have shaped the image of Aschersleben since the 19th century, but since the state garden show in 2010, they have become particularly inviting for taking pleasant strolls. With the **promenade ring**, the people of Aschersleben created a gem of secluded paths from the former moat around the historic city fortifications. Equally attractive is the **city park** with the adjoining rose garden and the **Eine-Terrasse**, which allows everyone to experience the course of the river. The heart of the inner-city parks, on the other hand, beats on the **Herrenbreite**. On the opposite side is the modern

Bestehornpark. The parks are part of the "Garden Dreams – Historical Parks in Saxony-Anhalt" network.

The great scholar and son of the city, Adam Olearius (1599 – 1671), was the source of inspiration for the design of the grounds at the 2010 State Garden Show. It stands for the city's past as well as for the modern educational location. Elements of the original design can still be seen in the parks and gardens.

architecture route

Visitors to the city often first notice the many different styles of architecture. Gothic stands next to Renaissance, old next to new. It is this architectural diversity that gives the city its defining appearance. The impression is reinforced by the unique architecture of the Aschersleber city planning officer Dr. Hans Heckner, almost 100 of his buildings can be found in the city.

In addition to the appreciation of historically valuable buildings, attention was also paid to urban art installations or the modern architectural style. There is so much worth seeing in Aschersleben: industrial architecture, settlement construction, villas or the cemetery – a combination of stories of past generations and the present.
